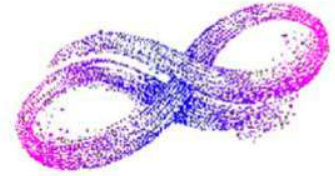

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MIROMA FLOWFORM

The Miroma is a larger Flowform - 770 mm wide and 800 mm long. It is an excellent Flowform for a garden setting, swimming pools, garden ponds and aquaculture. The feature of this Flowform is the beautiful fan of water that cascades from the outlet. The mesmerizing pulsating rhythm that this Flowform produces, peacefully penetrates your being.

The positive aspects of Flowforms are brought together in the Miroma - the strong lemniscate (the figure of 8 pattern of the water), and the rhythmical movements that bring about a calming and harmonising quality to the environment calling forth the sounds of a mountain stream or small waves lapping on a beach - a delight to sit next to.

The flow rate is up to 95 litres per minute and they are available in sandstone, terra cotta or charcoal colours and usually placed in a cascade of 5 Flowforms, although any number can be used, typically between 3 and 7.

FLOWFORMS

Flowforms are vessels that seek to emulate the swirls and vortices of the mountain stream, enabling water to reoxygenate, revitalise and rejuvenate itself, to bring it back to its more natural state – thereby assisting both the human and the plant kingdom. They form a cascade of water that flows into a tank or pool. The water can be recirculated as many times as desired.

The secret of the Flowform lies in it creating a “figure of 8” movement in the water - the lemniscate. This movement is one of the foundation patterns of all life. Oxygen is folded into the water, and the microorganisms are aided in breaking down the “unwanted matter” in a natural and gentle way.

In addition, the psychological effect of the contraction and expansion of the rhythmical movements of the Flowforms is of a calming quality and can produce an enlivening and awakening of the senses.

This dynamic movement, which calls forth the sounds of a mountain stream or small waves on a beach, through the rhythms, sounds and pulses the water produces, gives rise to a breathing quality.

The Miroma are the aesthetic “domestic” or “landscape” model, used to create medium to large sized water features.

It is a delightful flowform that brings a peaceful ambience to any garden setting.

They are placed on landscaped steps. Usually at least 3 bowls are used, but any number of bowls can be placed in either a straight or serpentine manner depending of the visual effect being created.

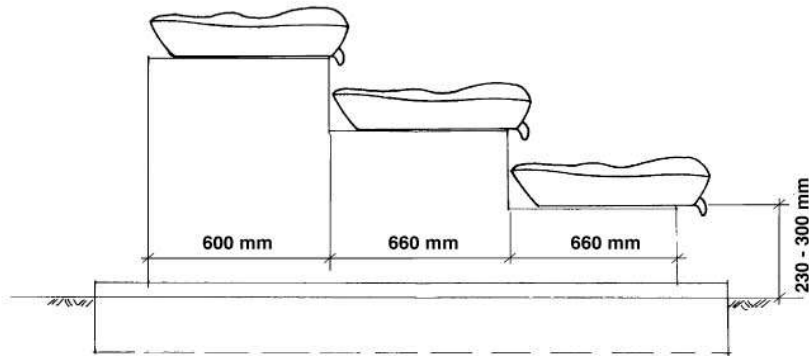


USES OF FLOWFORMS

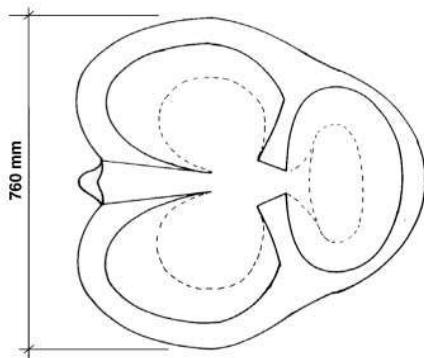
- ❑ Creating a rhythmical ambience, beautifying parks and gardens.
- ❑ Swimming pools - use Flowforms to keep the water more alive and needing less chemicals.
- ❑ Revitalising drinking water - Flowforms are used on town water, tank water and dams to enhance water's life giving properties.
- ❑ Aquaculture - Flowforms oxygenate and revitalise water that creates a healthy environment that fish thrive in.
- ❑ Removing smells and oxygenating contaminated water.



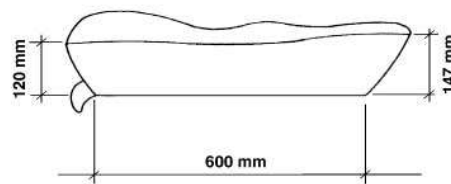
